<b>Facts</b>	<p>This Notice provides an overview of the practices of Organon &amp; Co. (Jersey City, NJ, USA) and its affiliates with respect to the collection, use and disclosure of personal data about patients, consumers, and caregivers globally.</p> <p>This Notice is not intended to replace other notices or consents provided by our Company to patients, consumers, and caregivers in accordance with local laws and regulations or for specific programs. In the event of any conflict between notices or consents required by local law and this Notice, the notices or consents required by local law will prevail.</p>
<b>Privacy at Organon</b>	<p>At Organon, a global research-based pharmaceutical company, privacy is fundamentally about trust. We demonstrate our commitment to privacy by establishing a global privacy program to support compliance with applicable privacy laws and standards for protecting personal information around the world.</p>
<b>Why?</b>	<p>We collect, use and share identifiable information ("personal information") about patients, consumers and caregivers as permitted by law in connection with our everyday business operations such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• product safety and product complaint reporting</li><li>• other communications made by you, your doctor or someone else on your behalf through our call centers or by postal mail or e-mail sent to us</li><li>• patient assistance, prescription discount and reimbursement support programs</li><li>• communicating information about diseases, products and services through our web sites, via e-mail, direct mail and other channels</li><li>• health educational programs, publications and tools online and offline</li><li>• business and marketing research</li><li>• auditing our programs and resources for compliance and security purposes</li><li>• as required or expressly authorized by laws applicable to our business globally</li></ul> <p>Many of these programs require that you provide specific consent and/or authorization for the collection, use and disclosure of personal information about you at the time you choose to participate in these programs. You may be asked to provide your consent and/or authorization by filling out a paper form, an online form, in a telephone discussion or by a text message.</p> <p>If you participate in a clinical study sponsored by Organon, personal information about you will be collected and shared with Organon and its affiliates as described in the consent and authorization forms you sign when you choose to participate in the study.</p>
<b>What?</b>	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the nature of your interactions with Organon. This information can include, among other things:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• contact information</li><li>• health information</li><li>• date of birth or age</li><li>• programs and activities in which you participated</li><li>• your communications preferences</li><li>• name of your health care provider(s)</li><li>• information about where you fill prescriptions</li><li>• your insurance information</li><li>• information about your family members and other members of your household; and your hobbies and interests</li></ul>

For example, if our computer servers are managed by an affiliate, we will not be to record and process the information necessary to provide the service to you.
To other companies we collaborate with solely for activities related to products and services jointly offered or developed by us and that company	Yes, based on written agreements in place between us and those companies.	Yes, if you specifically request to opt-out.
