Progress to date on our global commitment

Innovating, For Her

- Completed 8 transactions since 2021 to advance innovation in women's health, and in areas of unmet medical need.
- Working closely with UNFPA on several innovative sexual reproductive health (SRH) programming and policy initiatives, including:
- Launched an innovation challenge with MIT Solv(ed) for young people to develop solutions that improve access to SRH resources.
- Became the first private sector partner to join the Equity 2030 Alliance, an initiative with a call to action to normalize gender equity in science and technology.

Accelerating Access, For Her

- Leveraging expertise from UNFPA, investors, governments and NGOs; and signed an agreement with CAF, Development Bank of Latin America, to advance a model of sustainable, results-based financing for women's health. Programs in Mexico, Brazil, Ecuador and Panama to date.
- Launched "Her Plan is Her Power," a three-year, \$30 million initiative that expands the company's efforts to help reduce unplanned pregnancies.
- Working to prevent 120 million unplanned pregnancies by 2030, as part of our FP2030 commitment. Our Her Promise Access initiative has driven significant progress and we are now halfway to our goal.
- Committed to new funding and product donations to help improve access to resources within contraceptive deserts across the United States. Initial NGO partners include Direct Relief and Power to Decide.
 - Supporting UNFPA's implementation of an enhanced Safe Delivery App to improve access to real-time data for healthcare workers in low-resource settings. The app is in use by healthcare workers in more than 40 countries and has reached an estimated 300,000 people.

Advocating, For Her

- Partnered with the White Ribbon Alliance to implement an initiative aimed at mobilizing 1 million women to voice their health priorities and improve policies for women's health and well-being.
- Partnered with the European Parliamentary Forum for Sexual and Reproductive Rights (EPF) to launch the Global Contraception Policy Atlas, a powerful tool to advocate for increased investments in access to contraception.
- Collaborated with Women Deliver, which advocates for improved access to sexual and reproductive health information and services.
 - Launched a global grants program to empower women and girls when it comes to their reproductive health. The first round of grants was awarded to nine programs working across 13 countries.
